



COVID-19 INFECTION CONTROL PLAN RIDING LESSONS & DAY CAMPS

The following plan is in place to reduce the chances of people getting sick from COVID-19 and to limit the spread of COVID-19.

All: Parents, Riders, Staff, Volunteers

- Travelers from outside the US: As designated by CDC policies, no one will be allowed on the property at the Stables for 14 days from the date that they returned from travelling out of the country. The same requirement applies to people who live with a person who has travelled out of the country in the past 14 days. Everyone will be screened for travel.

- Camper registration is restricted to campers who live in the transmission area. No staff may commute from a high transmission area to camp.
- Phase 1 and 2 campers are restricted to campers who live in the “local geographic” area.
- Phase 3 campers are accepted from limited transmission areas.
- Positive COVID-19 testing: If any person who comes on property tests positive for COVID-19, they must inform Eugene Barnes, WBC General Manager (360-618-2694). The affected program will be suspended immediately for 2-5 days and possibly longer.

 - Anyone who was on site at the Stables during or following a visit by a person testing positive may be contacted by the Snohomish County Health Department or Warm Beach Camp.
 - If any person who comes on property is exposed to someone who has tested positive for COVID-19, that person should follow CDC guidelines for self-quarantine and cannot return to the program for 14 days and only if free of symptoms.
 - Others who were in contact with the person that was exposed to COVID-19 shall be contacted and must not return to the program for 72 hours and only if symptom free. Six feet is described as six feet for more than a few seconds of “walking past.”
- No one with signs or symptoms of COVID-19 should come to the facility. Posters will be displayed with signs and symptoms. Anyone who comes to the facility and starts to experience symptoms of the coronavirus will immediately be separated from others, provided a face mask if they are not using one, and sent home with instructions and guidance on how to follow-up with their health care professional.
- Masks will be worn when social distancing of 6 feet is not possible. Masks are not required when horseback riding.

Parent/Rider Procedures

Each parent/guardian or adult is responsible for determining whether the risk of exposure is acceptable based on the rider’s health and vulnerability. Warm Beach Camp staff will do their

best to minimize the risk of spread of COVID-19; however, the Camp cannot guarantee a virus-free environment.

- To limit the number of people on site, parents should bring the minimum necessary number of people needed to care for the rider.
- Upon arrival, riders will gather above the hitching rails 6' apart for daily health screening.
 - Instructors will do a verbal health check with riders at the beginning of every session. Instructors will ask each rider individually if he/she has any COVID-19 symptoms, about recent travel, and possible exposure to COVID-19. Instructors will document information that is collected.
 - Temperatures will be taken.
 - To promote healthy hygiene practices, on day one at lesson sessions or camp the nurse (or her designee) will teach hand washing, proper putting on, wearing, and taking off masks, sneezing protocol, and no touching of waste cans.
- Following the screening, everyone will wash their hands at a hand washing station for 20 seconds, following the CDC guidelines.
- Warm Beach Camp provides sanitized helmets; however, riders are encouraged to bring their own helmets.
- Riders can bring their own clean reins with input from instructors for rein selection.
- Parents may wait for their child inside their car or outside so long as 6' social distancing is maintained.
- Parents can bring their own chairs and maintain a minimum of 6' social distancing from anyone not in their household. They can bring a simple folding chair - without a bag. Warm Beach Camp reserves the right to refuse a chair due to safety concerns of horses.
- Families will be asked to leave promptly after class to limit the number of people on site and to allow for cleaning, sanitizing and disinfecting.

Staff & Volunteers

- Staff and volunteers will be following recommendations from the CDC including, but not limited to, frequent sanitizing of equipment, social distancing and wearing face masks when appropriate distancing is not possible.
- Staff and volunteers will complete a daily health screening.

Programming

- Lesson group sizes will follow CDC guidelines. For example, when riders are put in groups, high priority will be placed upon keeping the groups and staff consistent for the duration of the camp.
- Horses will be separated using every other cross-tie stall or a minimum of 10' apart at the hitching rail.



- Clean tack will be placed on saddle racks near tacking area. Tack stands will be cleaned and sanitized after each use.
- Tack rooms will have restricted access for authorized personnel only.
- Rider belongings will be kept separate. No sharing of books or tack. Social distancing will be maintained, i.e., no hugging.

Horses

- Although there is no evidence that horses can contract or become ill from COVID-19, Warm Beach Camp expects that everyone practice good hygiene by washing hands with soap and water for a minimum of 20 seconds or using a >60% alcohol hand sanitizer before and after touching a horse. Do not pet or kiss their noses to avoid any possible cross contamination of the horse.

Action Plan in Case Staff, Rider or Visitor Becomes Sick

- A specified area with adult supervision will be used for anyone who has COVID-19 symptoms.
- A transport home procedure will be followed.
- The sick person will notify his/her supervisor who will notify Eugene Barnes, WBC General Manager. Eugene will immediately notify health officials, staff and families of any possible case of COVID-19 while maintaining confidentiality as required by the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).
- The area used by the sick person will be closed until cleaned. If possible, a minimum of 24 hours will be established as the time that must pass before the space is cleaned. This action minimizes the person doing the cleaning from getting sick.
- The sick person cannot return to camp until he/she has met the CDC criteria to discontinue home isolation.
- Anyone exposed to the sick person must stay home and monitor their symptoms following CDC guidance.

Release of Liability

I understand that participation is at my/our own risk and release Warm Beach Camp & Conference Center, staff, and volunteers, from any liability by choosing to participate or allowing my child to participate.
